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Untouched Kyrgyzstan

Day 1 – Bazaars, Brutalism & the Road to Issyk-Kul

Begin your adventure in Bishkek, where leafy boulevards mask Soviet skeletons and bazaars hum with life, before heading east toward Kyrgyzstan’s vast alpine lake.

- Wander Bishkek’s bustling **Osh Bazaar** and **Soviet-era brutalist structures**
- Gaze up at the concrete monuments in **Ala-Too Square** and **Panfilov Park**
- Explore Bishkek’s numerous **Soviet vestiges**, from Lenin statues in city parks to the Soviet sickle-and-hammer emblems still affixed on building facades
- Take a 3-hour train ride to Tokmok (if in season), a nod to Central Asia’s railway heritage, or drive to Balykchy
- Reach **Balykchy**, an old Soviet rustbelt town where the steppe meets Lake Issyk-Kul
- Stroll along **Balykchy’s lakeshore promenade**, and learn about the city’s once-thriving industrial complexes, and watch dusk settle over the peaks

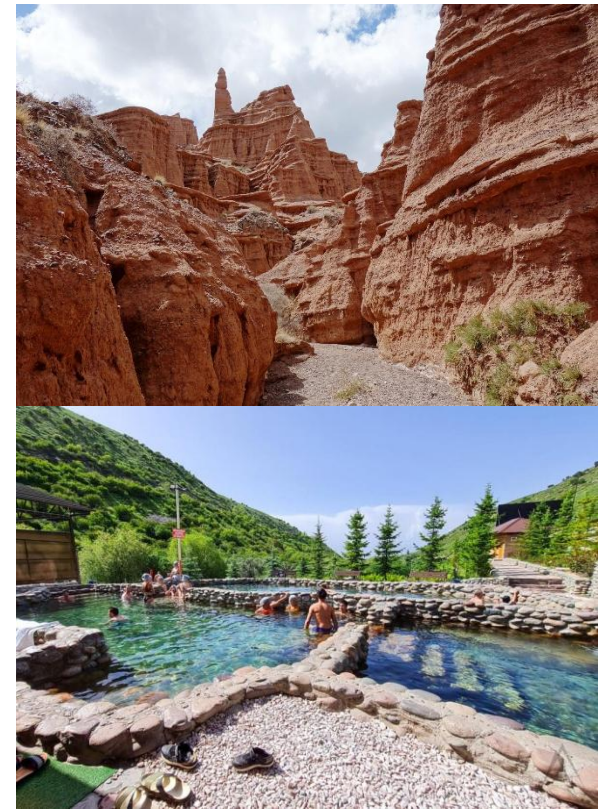
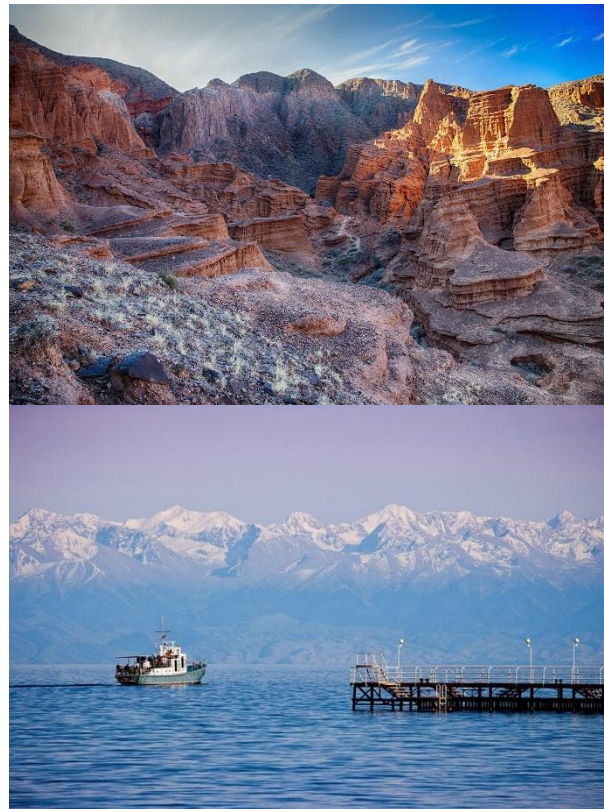


Day 2 – Flaming Canyons and Mountain Baths

Travel deep into Kyrgyzstan’s raw beauty — from jagged red canyons to steaming hot springs in alpine valleys.

- Hike and climb (2 hours, moderate – 100 metre steep ascent) through the surreal Martian-like red-rock formations of **Kok Moynok Canyon**
- 1-hour boat ride on **Lake Issyk Kul**, one of the largest freshwater lakes in the world
- Wind along the **northern shores of Issyk-Kul** with mountain views on all sides
- Soak in the natural **Aksu hot springs**, known for its supposed healing properties, and nestled near the lake’s edge and in the mountainous valleys overlooking Karakol
- Continue onward to **Karakol**, gateway to Kyrgyzstan’s east and the Tian Shen mountains

Day 3 – Faith, Food, Waterfalls and Village Life

A day of architectural contrast and cultural immersion — mosques, churches, and Dungan cuisine await.

- Visit the wooden **Dungan Mosque**, that serves the Chinese-speaking Dungan community, and the ornate and wooden Holy Trinity Cathedral
- Travel to **Yirdik**, a village of the Dungan community, whose origins trace back to ancient China. They speak a language that is derived from Old Chinese.
- Try **Ashlyanfu**, a spicy noodle soup rooted in Dungan traditions, a Muslim ethnic groups with roots to mainland China
- Hike 1 hour in a **lush alpine forest** to the **Jeti Oguz waterfalls**, fed by snowmelt cascading from the surrounding alpine peaks.
- Overnight in a **traditional Kyrgyz yurt**, situated in the middle of a deep and verdant Jeti Oguz valley

Day 4 – Fairytales in Stone, Passes in the Sky

Cross dramatic terrain today — canyons shaped like dragons and a high-altitude pass once trodden by Soviet convoys.

- Drive to the **Barksoon Gorge** and hike 1 hour along a glacial river trail
- Marvel at the rushing and dramatic rapids of the **Barksoon waterfalls**.
- Trek through **Skazka Canyon (“Fairytale Canyon”)** on a whimsical 1.5-hour hike past uniquely shaped cliffs and rainbow-hued rock formations.
- Drive 2 hours to **Kaji-Say (Engilchek)**, a half-abandoned Soviet spa and mining town that seems to be frozen in time
- End the day in the quiet lakeside village of **Tong**

Day 5 – Lakes, Hills & Hidden Canyons

Follow the southern shore of Issyk-Kul, where hills meet canyons and wild swimming gives way to desert cliffs.

- Visit a beach and swim in the pristine waters of **Lake Issyk Kul**
- Journey to **Ak Sai Canyon** (1 hour drive) and walk its narrow gorges and take in the sights of its undulating landscape (2 kilometre hike, 2 hours)
- Head west into the quiet green valleys of **Shabdan Village** and experience local life through a homestay
- Hike (1 hour) to the **confluence of the mighty and raging rapids of the Chon Kemin and Chuy rivers**
- Return to the homestay and settle in with a village dinner prepared by your friendly hosts

Day 6 – Rural life in a fertile valley

Spend the day soaking in the rhythms of daily life in the lush, fertile Chon Kemin Valley — where tradition and nature intertwine. Explore Shabdan’s farms, markets, and one-room schools

- Watch **nomadic sports** and **traditional games** (if available – seasonal)
- **Ride horses for 3-4 hours** through the open valleys, idyllic villages and fertile farmlands of the Chuy region and along the Chong-Kemin River
- Visit neighbours and learn about village customs and hospitality
- Visit hubs of local rural life, with **visits to local schools, bazaars** and **communal spaces**
- **Experience farm living** in a farm homestay nestled in the fertile Chon Kemin valley

Day 7 – Glacial Valleys, Sacred Peaks & Urban Rhythms

Leave the homesteads of Shabdan and follow a ribbon of asphalt into alpine wilderness — before descending once again into the pulse of the capital.

- Drive 4 hours along a **scenic mountain highway** to **Ala Archa National Park**
- **Hike 7 km (2–3 hours)** through pine forests, alpine meadows, and glacier-fed streams beneath snow-draped peaks
- Spot wild ibex or golden eagles while breathing in the highland air
- Return to Bishkek by early evening (1 hour drive)
- Visit the **Turkish-inspired National Mosque** and stroll through the leafy boulevards of Bishkek, where statues of Lenin still have a pride of place
- **Dine on Dungan cuisine** — a rich fusion of Central Asian and Chinese-Muslim flavours

Day 8 – Into the Spine of Kyrgyzstan: Highway to Toktogul

Cross into the south via a road that defies gravity — the Bishkek – Osh road, a highland highway etched into cliffs and carved through clouds.

- Depart Bishkek and drive 7 hours south via **the famed Bishkek – Osh Highway**
- Traverse the **Ala-Bel mountain Pass** and **Too Ashu Tunnel** — both over 3,200m in elevation – and enjoy panoramic views of snow-capped mountains, deep gorges, and verdant plains
- Pass grazing horses, Soviet-era rest stops, and shepherds on windswept ridgelines, and nomadic yurts that litter the landscape
- Descend into the basin of the **Soviet-built Toktogul Reservoir**, the largest reservoir in Kyrgyzstan.
- Explore **Toktogul** — a faded Soviet-era town where murals peel, but stories endure

Day 9 – Lakeside Strolls & Silk Road Echoes in Osh

From the stillness of Toktogul’s shores to the bustle of Kyrgyzstan’s oldest city, today is a journey through river valleys, canyons, and time itself.

- Enjoy a short hike along the quiet shores of **Lake Toktogul** in the morning light
- Drive 7 hours south toward Osh, weaving through valleys, switchbacks, and red rock canyons
- Marvel at mountain passes and pastoral villages along the Bishkek – Osh highway
- Arrive in Osh and ascend the **Suleiman Too Cave Complex** — a UNESCO-listed hill with sacred caves and panoramic views
- Watch the sunset over the Fergana Valley from the Suleiman Too Cave Complex, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and place of religious and spiritual significance
- Visit **Osh Bazaar**, an agricultural bazaar and market where traders, farmers and cattle herders sell their goods, produce and livestock

Day 10 – Into the Highlands: Tulpar Kul & the Alay Range

Climb back into the wild — past the villages of Sary Tash and Sary Mogul — until the road ends at the high-altitude lake of Tulpar Kul.

- Drive 8 hours south from Osh toward the **foothills of the Alay Mountains**
- **Drive off-road** on gravel roads and across raging rapids, and pass dusty mountain hamlets and open plains framed by the Alay Mountain Range
- Arrive at **Tulpar Kul** (3,500m), a glacial lake resting beneath towering Lenin Peak, one of the tallest peaks in Central Asia and the former Soviet Union
- Settle into the warmth and cosiness of a **traditional Kyrgyz yurt** surrounded by silence, stars, and snow

Note: *Shower times may be limited at the yurt to certain times of the day, or may not be available altogether due to its remote location*

Day 11 – Where the Sky Begins: Hiking at Lenin Peak Base

The air is thin and the world feels endless — hike where climbers prepare to scale one of Central Asia’s mightiest mountains.

- **Hike 3–5 hours** (moderate – some up hill portions, but not technical) through grasslands and rocky trails to **Lenin Peak Base Camp** and the surrounding nature
- Pass grazing yaks, glacial streams, and weather-worn cairns under the shadows of **Lenin Peak** (7100 metres)
- Picnic beside **Tulpar Kul** or sip tea in a local herder’s yurt
- Experience highland living in the **Alay mountains** with a yurt stay in a traditional **Kyrgyz yurt**
- Settle into the warmth and cosiness of a traditional **Kyrgyz yurt** surrounded by silence, stars, and snow

Accommodation: Traditional Kyrgyz yurt in Tulpar Kul

Day 12 – Descent & Departure: Back to Osh

Your final journey winds down from the roof of the country back to its southern soul.

- Drive 7 hours from Tulpar Kul to **Osh** in the early morning.
- Drive across – one last time – **lush pastures**, tall **mountain passes**, and **deep valleys**.
- Board a **domestic flight** in the mid-afternoon to Bishkek (1 hour), and enjoy breathtaking aerial views of Kyrgyzstan’s mountainous terrain
- **Arrive in the capital by 7pm**, where the journey ends, and the memories surely begin
